### Day Camp:

New this year is a day camp from 9:00-4:30. Campers may choose to attend one day or all 3 days. Cost is \$5.00 per day, lunch included. For more information, check out our website at www.silvermaplecamp.org

### Registration and Costs:

Due to the popularity of Silver Maple Camp, it is recommended that you send in your registration form at least 10 days prior to the camp session. The earlier reservations are made, the better to aid the directors in planning. *Campers registering on Sunday of the camp session will be charged an additional \$25.00.*

The cost for each session will be \$140.00 if pre-registered.

- \$50.00 Pre-registration fee (due with registration form at least 10 days prior to camp session)
- \$90.00 (due on Sunday of camp session)

The fee includes crafts, canteen and one T-shirt. It does not include the cost of meals for visitors. Refunds for cancellations will be made only if the camp is notified in writing prior to the first of July. The camp fee includes sales tax.

### Arrival and Departure:

All campers should register between 2 and 4 p.m. on Sunday. It is important that campers be there at those times to facilitate the camp beginning on time. The camp will close Saturday morning. Please pick up your camper as soon as possible after 8:00 a.m and before 10:00 am.

### Evening Worship:

An acceptable appearance for the evening worship service is expected of everyone. Boys should wear clean shirts and pants. Girls should wear dresses or pants. **No shorts for boys or girls at evening worship.**

### Camp Rules:

1. Personal conduct of all campers will be in keeping with the Christian ideals of the camp-- in speech, behavior, and dress.
2. Punctual attendance is expected at all camp activities, unless excused by director.
3. No one is to leave the camp property unless authorized by director.
4. Campers are subject to direction and correction by any staff member. Director may send home anyone guilty of disobedience.
5. Boys do not enter girl's area under any circumstances, and girls do not enter boy's area under any circumstances.
6. There is no place in camp for "rough housing" or practical jokes which, though not intended, can result in injury or property damage. No one is to be thrown in the lake at any time, for any reason.
7. Modest dress will be expected at all times. Knee length shorts will be allowed. No T-shirts with questionable pictures or sayings allowed. Director will monitor and be the final word on appropriate dress.
8. Each camper is responsible for his own belongings. Borrowing is discouraged. Please put name tags in clothing.
9. Campers are expected to be clean and observe rules of good personal hygiene. Daily showering is expected.

### Prohibited items include:

- a. No tobacco, alcohol or drugs are permitted at camp. If prescription drugs are required, complete medical form and inform director.
- b. No fireworks, matches, lighters, guns, knives, or weapons of any kind are allowed at camp.
- c. **No cell phones, radios, TVs, stereos, electronic games, iPods, etc. are allowed at camp.**

### What to Bring:\*

Sack lunch for Sunday evening meal.

Bible, notebook, pencil, jeans, t-shirts, shorts, bedding, towels, laundry bag, bathrobe, all necessary toilet articles, flashlight, swim suit, ball glove, fishing pole, camera (opt.).

**GIRLS--** dresses, pants/capris for evening worship

**BOYS--** dress shirts and pants for evening worship

\*With limited cabin space, underbed storage or suitcases that will store below bunks are ideal for camp.

\*All cabins are air-conditioned, campers do not need to bring fans for personal use.
